1. As an organisation, we take a zero tolerance approach to offences under the Modern Slavery Act 2015 or indeed to any violation of human rights. We require the same from our suppliers, contractors and anyone else that we do business with.
2. We are committed to upholding the principles and objectives of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. Ensuring that we have a reputable and dependable supply chain helps safeguard the reputation and integrity of our business and enables us to continue to operate a high standard of service to our customers.

 - financial advisory services

Our policy on slavery and human trafficking

Gaffer Group is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in any part of our business and we require our suppliers to have similar principles and practices designed to ensure that this does not happen. The group's procurement process includes supplier risk assessments which are undertaken periodically to ensure effective compliance.

8. All managers are responsible for ensuring that we comply with the legislative and regulatory requirements. This includes giving consideration to modern slavery factors when making procurement decisions and to developing an awareness of modern slavery issues through training of staff.
9. This Statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Gaffer Group's anti-slavery and human trafficking statement.
